Exodus 16:2-21

And the whole congregation of the people of Israel grumbled against Moses and

Aaron in the wilderness, ³ and the people of Israel said to them, "Would that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the meat pots and ate bread to the full, for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger."⁴ Then the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, I am about to rain bread from heaven for you, and the people shall go out and gather a day's portion every day, that I may test them, whether they will walk in my law or not. ⁵ On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather daily." 6 So Moses and Aaron said to all the people of Israel, "At evening you shall know that it was the LORD who brought you out of the land of Egypt, ⁷ and in the morning you shall see the alory of the LORD, because he has heard your arumbling against the LORD. For what are we, that you grumble against us?" 8 And Moses said, "When the LORD gives you in the evening meat to eat and in the morning bread to the full, because the LORD has heard your grumbling that you arumble against him-- what are we? Your grumbling is not against us but against the LORD." 9 Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the people of Israel, 'Come near before the LORD, for he has heard your grumbling."¹⁰ And as soon as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of

people of Israel. Say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall be filled with bread. Then you shall know that I am the LORD your God." ¹³ In the evening quail came up and covered the camp, and in the morning dew lay around the camp. ¹⁴ And when the dew had gone up, there was on the face of the wilderness a fine, flake-like thing, fine as frost on the ground.¹⁵ When the people of Israel saw it, they said to one another, "What is it?" For they did not know what it was. And Moses said to them, "It is the bread that the LORD has given you to eat. ¹⁶ This is what the LORD has commanded: 'Gather of it, each one of you, as much as he can eat. You shall each take an omer, according to the number of the persons that each of you has in his tent."¹⁷ And the people of Israel did so. They gathered, some more, some less. ¹⁸ But when they measured it with an omer, whoever gathered much had nothing left over, and whoever aathered little had no lack. Each of them gathered as much as he could eat.¹⁹ And Moses said to them, "Let no one leave any of it over till the morning." ²⁰ But they did not listen to Moses. Some left part of it till the morning, and it bred worms and stank. And Moses was anary with them.²¹ Morning by morning they gathered it, each as much as he could eat; but when the sun grew hot, it melted.

So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day

about three thousand souls. ⁴² And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³ And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴ And all who believed were together and had all things in common. ⁴⁵ And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶ And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and having favor with all the people. John 6:22-35

On the next day the crowd that remained on the other side of the sea saw that there

had been only one boat there, and that Jesus had not entered the boat with his disciples, but that his disciples had gone away alone.²³ Other boats from Tiberias came near the place where they had eaten the bread after the Lord had given thanks. ²⁴ So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor his disciples, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum, seeking Jesus. ²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" ²⁶ Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you are seeking me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. ²⁷ Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you. For on him God the Father has set his seal." ²⁸ Then they said to him, "What must we do, to be doing the works of God?" 29 Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." ³⁰ So they said to him, "Then what sign do you do,

that we may see and believe you? What work do you perform? ³¹ Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'' ³² Jesus then said to them, ''Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is he who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'' ³⁴ They said to him, ''Sir, give us this bread always.'' ³⁵ Jesus said to them, ''I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst.''



Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions

March 31st – April 5th, 2025

Mon John 11:1-16 When Jesus hears that Lazarus is sick, He does not immediately go to help. This does **not** mean that He lacks love, but that He has greater understanding than we, His followers, do.

Tues John 11:17-27 Four days in the tomb, decaying – this is not too great a problem for the Resurrection and the Life. Such is the glory of the Christ, the Son of God who was to come into the world (v4,v27).

Wed 2 Corinthians 5:14-21 Since Christ died for all, all died, and His resurrection declares that we are also reconciled to God. Christ became sin for us that we might become righteousness in Him (v21).

Thurs Isaiah 64:1-4 Because enemies trample the sanctuary, Isaiah calls upon God to descend with power and rescue His people, both from their earthly foes and from His own just judgment upon their sins.

Fri Isaiah 64:5-12 Even on the cross Jesus never stopped looking to God for help. Isaiah also, admitting guilt, still looks to God for mercy. Do not be angry, Lord, without limit, or remember our guilt forever (v9).

Sat Exodus 3:1-14 The Lord comes to Moses in a burning bush at a time when Moses no longer thinks he can deliver the Israelites from Egypt. God says: This is my time, and **I am** will be with you!
