

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions

September 1st – 6th, 2025

Mon John 5:30-36 Jesus does not operate on His own, nor does He testify about Himself. Besides the Father who sent Him, John the Baptizer testified about Jesus, and so do the works that Jesus carries out.

Tues Acts 8:9-13 Simon the magician had a following in Samaria until they believed the Good News about Jesus. Then even Simon himself believes, and is amazed by the signs and great miracles among the believers.

Wed Acts 8:14-17 The apostles hear about the Samaritans believing and send Peter and John. Peter and John pray and lay on hands, and the Samaritan believers receive the special gift of the Holy Spirit.

Thurs Acts 8:18-25 Simon offers money for the power to give the Holy Spirit to others. Peter rebukes him and calls upon him to repent and to pray for forgiveness. Simon asks Peter to pray for him also.

Fri 2 Samuel 7:1-16 David wants to build a house for the Lord, but the Lord says "no." You are the Lord's warrior. My house will be built by a man of peace. Looking ahead, we also see the Prince of Peace!

Sat Ezekiel 8:9-16 The prophet declares disaster and destruction for the temple which is being desecrated by all sorts of abominations that do not bring the peace of God for which His house was intended.



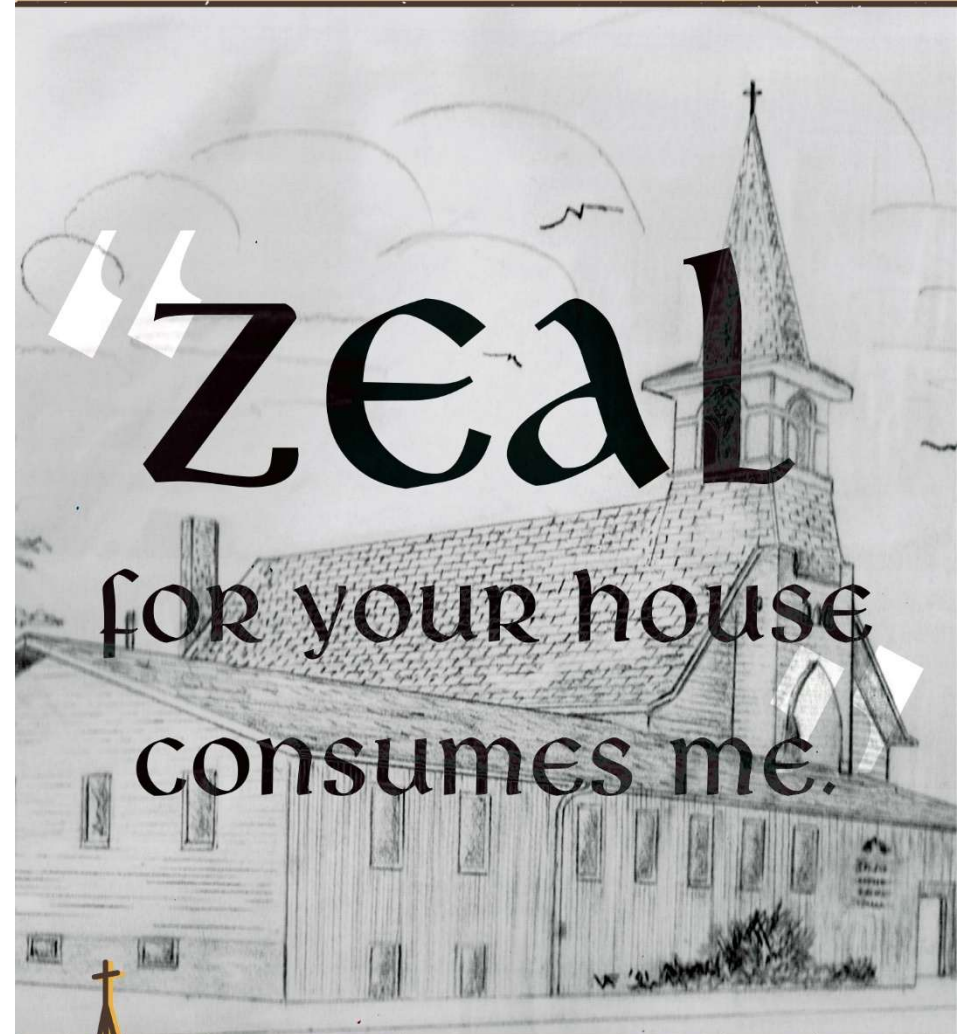

Prayer Opportunities

Minneapolis – This past week, a shooting took place at Assumption Catholic Church in Minneapolis, taking the lives of an 8-year-old boy and a 10-year-old girl. **Ask** the Lord to be with the families of these children and all the other victims. **Pray** that the Lord would use these terrible events to bring these families closer to Him. **Ask** that the Lord would continue to use His Word to turn hearts from hatred to love.

Tanzania – Missionary Naumann has identified several essential improvements needed for the seminary facilities. These include replacing the seminary door, which has deteriorated due to rainfall, and installing an overhanging roof to safeguard the new door and prevent water from entering classrooms, completing two small instructor offices, and office furniture. Completion of these projects is dependent upon sufficient support from MDF offerings. Following Pastor Lengutai's retirement, the TZCLC has appointed Pastor Tobias Mbise as his successor on the seminary faculty. **Pray** for the seminary students as they continue to prepare for service in our Savior's kingdom as faithful preachers and teachers of God's saving Word. **Ask** for the Lord's continued blessings and provision for the instructors, Missionary Naumann, Pastor Loskira, Pastor Issangya, and the newly appointed Pastor Mbise.

India – Seventeen students graduated and were ordained as CLCI pastors in late June. These men successfully completed three years of full-time theological studies at the CLCI seminary and will now be assigned to new and established CLCI congregations. A joint pastoral conference of the CLCI and BELC is tentatively being planned for October to coincide with Missionary Ohlmann's planned visit. Please **pray** that the Lord will protect, support, and strengthen the faith of His children in India, especially amid the increasing persecution against Christians. Also, **ask** the Lord to bless the new pastors of CLCI and the preparations for the upcoming pastoral conference in October.

CLC ManUp! – The CLC men's retreat ManUp! is now seven weeks away. To register for \$75, registrations must be submitted by August 31. On September 1, the price to register goes up to \$150. The dates for this year's retreat are Thursday – Sunday, September 25-28.

Jeremiah 7:1-11

The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD: ² "Stand in the gate of the LORD's house, and proclaim there this word, and say, Hear the word of the LORD, all you men of Judah who enter these gates to worship the LORD. ³ Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Amend your ways and your deeds, and I will let

you dwell in this place. ⁴ Do not trust in these deceptive words: 'This is the temple of the LORD, the temple of the LORD, the temple of the LORD.' ⁵ "For if you truly amend your ways and your deeds, if you truly execute justice one with another, ⁶ if you do not oppress the sojourner, the fatherless, or the widow, or shed innocent blood in this place, and if you do not go after other gods to your own harm, ⁷ then I will let you dwell in this place, in the land that I gave of old to your fathers forever. ⁸ "Behold, you trust in deceptive words to no avail. ⁹ Will you steal, murder, commit adultery, swear falsely, make offerings to Baal, and go after other gods that you have not known, ¹⁰ and then come and stand before me in this house, which is called by my name, and say, 'We are delivered!'—only to go on doing all these abominations? ¹¹ Has this house, which is called by my name, become a den of robbers in your eyes? Behold, I myself have seen it, declares the LORD.

P The Holy Gospel is written in the nineteenth chapter of St. Luke, beginning at the forty-first verse:

G *Glory be to Thee, O Lord!*



Luke 19:41-48

And when he drew near and saw the city, he wept over it, ⁴² saying, "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes. ⁴³ For the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up a barricade around you and surround you and hem you in on every side ⁴⁴ and tear you down to the ground, you and your children within you. And they will not leave one stone upon another in you, because you did not know the time of your visitation." ⁴⁵ And he entered the temple and began to drive out those who sold, ⁴⁶ saying to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer,' but you have made it a den of robbers." ⁴⁷ And he was teaching daily in the temple. The chief priests and the scribes and the principal men of the people were seeking to destroy him, ⁴⁸ but they did not find anything they could do, for all the people were hanging on his words.

Romans 15:14-33

I myself am convinced about you, my brothers, that you yourselves are also full of goodness, filled with complete knowledge, and able to instruct one another. ¹⁵ But I have written a letter to you (rather boldly at times) as a reminder to you, because of the grace God has given me ¹⁶ to be a public minister of Christ Jesus to the Gentiles. I am to do the priestly work of proclaiming the gospel of God so that the Gentiles would be an acceptable offering, sanctified by the Holy Spirit. ¹⁷ Therefore I have a reason to boast in Christ Jesus about my service to God. ¹⁸ For I will not dare to speak about anything except those things Christ accomplished through me that resulted in the Gentiles' obedience. Christ accomplished them by word and deed, ¹⁹ along with the power of signs and wonders done by the power of God's Spirit. As a result, I have fully proclaimed the gospel of Christ from Jerusalem all the way around to Illyricum. ²⁰ And so I consider it an honor to proclaim the gospel where Christ's name is not known, so that I may not

build on another man's foundation. ²¹ Instead, as it is written: Those who were not told about him will see, and those who have not heard will understand. ²² This is also the reason I have been prevented many times from coming to you. ²³ But now I no longer have a place to work in these regions, and I have longed for many years to come to you. ²⁴ So when I go to Spain, I hope to visit you on my way. After I have enjoyed being with you for a while, I hope that you will help me on my journey there. ²⁵ Right now I am going to Jerusalem bringing assistance to the saints. ²⁶ For Macedonia and Achaia were pleased to make a certain contribution for the poor among the saints in Jerusalem. ²⁷ Indeed, they were pleased to do this and, to be sure, they are indebted to them. For if the Gentiles have come to share in their spiritual things, then the Gentiles owe it to them to serve them with material things. ²⁸ So, after I complete this project by delivering this fruit safely to them, I will set out for Spain and visit you on the way. ²⁹ And I know that when I come to you, I will arrive with the full blessing of Christ. ³⁰ Now I urge you, brothers, through our Lord Jesus Christ and through the love of the Spirit, to struggle with me in prayers to God on my behalf. ³¹ Pray that I may be rescued from those in Judea who are disobedient and that my service for Jerusalem may be acceptable to the saints, ³² so that by God's will I may come to you in joy and be refreshed in your company. ³³ May the God of peace be with you all. Amen.
