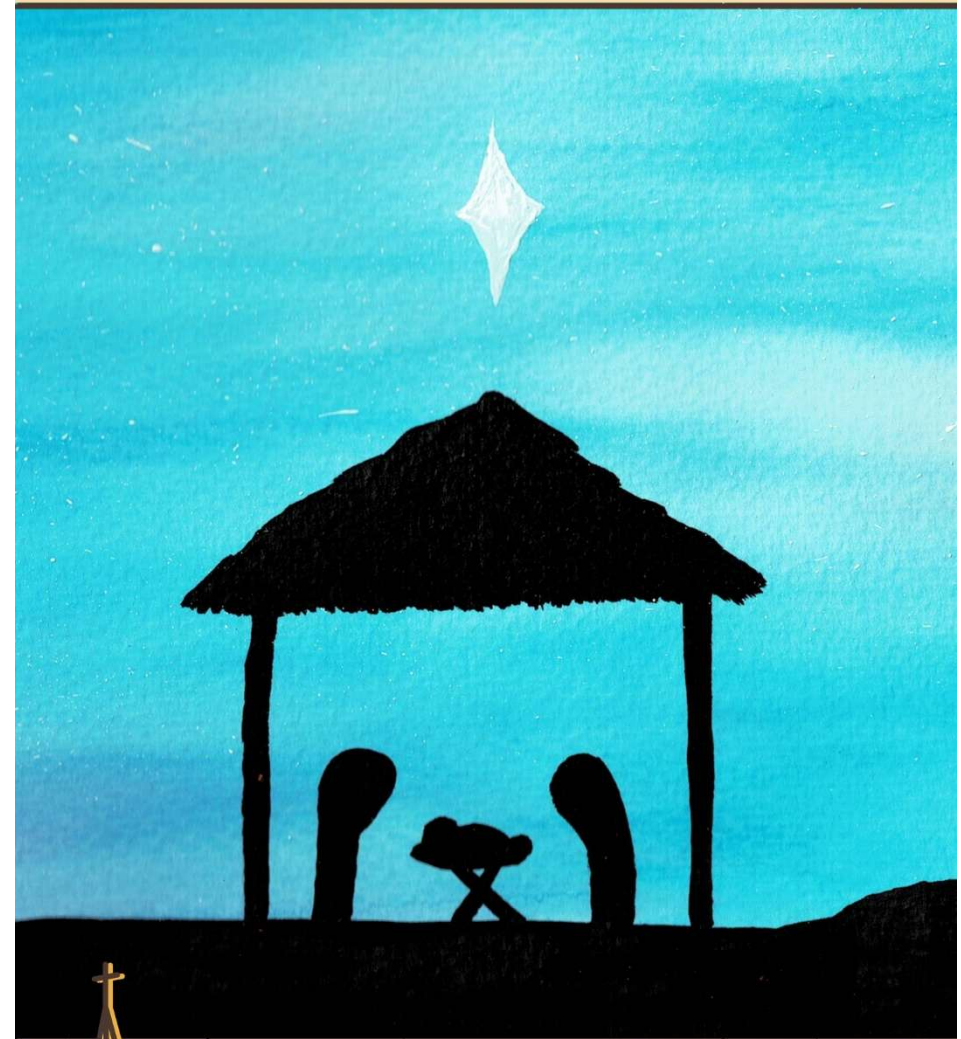

I. About God's Creation

Daniel: In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. (Genesis 1:1)

Lylyan: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. (John 1:1-2)

P What else can we tell you? We have told you of God's perfect creation, man's disobedience, and God's judgment. We have told you about God's promise of a Savior and Jesus' coming to fulfill that promise to be our Savior. So what's left?

LITTLE CHILDREN, CAN YOU TELL...

V. About God's Home

Bentley: Jesus said, In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. (John 14:2)

Nick: And if I go to prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. (John 14:3)

Grant: For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. (John 3:17)

Katherine: He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. (John 3:18)

Clara Jo: For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God. (Ephesians 6:23)

IV. About God's Gift
