Confession of Faith

Smalcald Articles: Article 1

C The first and chief article is this, that Jesus Christ, our God and Lord, died for our sins and was raised again for our justification. And He alone is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world and God has laid upon Him the iniquities of us all. Likewise: All have sinned and are justified without merit freely, and without their own works or merits by His grace, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, in His blood.

Since it is necessary to believe this, and it cannot be otherwise acquired or apprehended by any work, law, or merit, it is clear and certain that this faith alone justifies us. For we conclude that a man is justified by faith, without the deeds of the law, that God might be just, and the Justifier of him who believes in Christ.

Of this article nothing can be yielded or surrendered nor can anything be granted or permitted contrary to the same, even though heaven and earth, and whatever will not abide, should sink to ruin. For there is none other name under heaven given among men whereby we must be saved. And with His stripes we are healed. Amen.
