We have not always lived in the light of Christ's ascension, often forgetting His active reign and our calling to be His body on earth. Our focus has strayed to earthly concerns, and we have failed to witness boldly to His saving power. We have not perfectly loved You or our neighbor. For these sins, we are truly sorry and humbly repent. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ—His suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension—have mercy on us.**

P Upon this your confession, I, as a called servant of the Word, announce God's grace to you. Our ascended Lord Jesus Christ, now reigning at God's right hand, has accomplished full salvation for you. As He commanded before He ascended, forgiveness is proclaimed in His name. Because He is our active King and Intercessor, His pardon is freely given. Therefore, in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Luke 24:44-53

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, ⁴⁶ and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, ⁴⁷ and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." ⁵⁰ And he led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. ⁵¹ While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. ⁵² And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, ⁵³ and were continually in the temple blessing God.

Acts 1:1-11

In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, ²

until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³ He presented himself alive to them after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴ And while staying with them he ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me; ⁵ for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." ⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my

witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." ⁹ And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Mon Mark 16:14-20 Awaiting the promised Spirit, we remember how the risen Jesus sent the eleven out to preach the Word, how vital it is to believe that Word, and how He confirmed His Word by various signs.

Tues John 15:26–16:4 When the Counselor comes, He will testify about Jesus, and so will Jesus' apostles. Not all will believe the testimony, to be sure, but fierce opposition does not mean that the Spirit was wrong.

Wed 1 Peter 4:7-11 The approaching end times call for a sound mind and prayerful watching, but most of all for love which uses the gifts that God has given in service to one another on our heavenly walk.

Thurs Ezekiel 36:25-27 The Lord will cleanse from impurity and idolatry. The Lord will give a new heart and put His Spirit within, that we, His people, may be led to walk in His ways.

Fri Psalm 97 The Lord reigns. The earth, created by Him, rejoices in this. Fire, lightning, mountains, and heavens bow before Him. All other "gods" are nothing compared to Him. Let us also rejoice and give thanks!

Sat Psalm 93 The Lord rules forever. Majesty and strength are His clothing. He is mightier than the thundering waters, and His word stands firm. His holiness is what makes His house eternally beautiful.
